


Cower in Fear? or Trust in God! - by Elsbeth

At our ultrasound it was revealed that I have placenta previa. The placenta is a pancake shaped sack, passing nutrients from my body to the Baby through the umbilical cord. In a normal pregnancy it is located at the top or side of the uterus. Mine is at the bottom, completely blocking Baby Mae's exit. This occurs in about 0.5% of pregnancies. (CONTINUED BELOW)

We bought 5 tickets to Seoul, Korea departing on 27 April 2017! It has been a long journey up until this point, and we cannot express how excited we are. We are now working on getting our visas, finding a shipping company, arranging an

apartment in Korea, and taking one last trip to say goodbye to everyone.

Ideally, as I stretch and grow the placenta will move out of the way and I will be able to have a normal delivery. If nothing changes, I will have to have a scheduled c-section in the last month. There is a chance of bleeding,

especially as I start my third trimester. This can be dangerous for **the baby and me** and if it were to happen I would be put on complete

bedrest until Mae was large enough for safe delivery. As of right now, we (and our doctor) are going to treat this like a normal pregnancy, but with careful monitoring and some restrictions on my activities.
